

# Spring/ Summer 2013 Course Offerings

- #1. American Folk Art – Version II, Bob Jackman, @ COA, Cost \$20, 6 Sessions, Wednesdays, April 17 and 24 and May 1st, 8, 15 and 22. From 10 to 11:30am. Topics will include maritime folk art, hooked rugs, folk boxes, signs, store novelties and much more. Interaction is encouraged.**
- #2. Marshfield in Maps, Bob Jackman @ COA and Ventress Library, Cost \$20, 2 Separate Venue Offerings of 6 Sessions each, Course option 1 - Thursdays, April 18, 25, May 2, 9, 16, and 23rd from 10:00 – 11:30am at the COA or Course Option II - Thursdays, May 2, 9, 16, 23, 30 and June 6 from 6:00-7:30pm at the Ventress Library. The program surveys both historical Marshfield maps and exciting current specialized online maps. Particular attention will be given to Marshfield's shifting rivers and shorelines as recorded on maps.**


