Supt. Granatino updated the Committee on the following:

Asst. Supt. Martin updated the Committee on the following:

- Teaching & Learning Alliance: began coaching and mini courses; have 104 elementary staff who volunteered to take after school workshops
- Reading Specialists commended for their work with Trait Crates
- Science: Jennifer Love worked with FBMS for a full day
- Administration and Technology staff discussing MCAS 2.0 for Grades 4 and 8
- Beginning Teacher Institute: Susan Dupuis and Heather O'Neill presented instructional course

IV. MINUTES

MOTION: Mrs. Church moved to approve the minutes of October 18, 2016 as written. Mr. Greer second. VOTE: 3-0-1. (Shrand abstain)

V. OLD BUSINESS

Capital Budget FY'18-2022: Focus is on technology and building security.

MOTION: Mr. Greer moved FY'18-22 Capital Budget Planning as presented. Mrs. Church second. VOTE: 3-0-1. (Shrand abstain)

VI. NEW BUSINESS

Marshfield High School AFS Trip: World Language staff member, Patricia Salamone and MHS students Mackenzie Dee and Rachel Benson, presented American Field Service 2017 (April 27-30) trip to Barker High School in New York. Students will hold fundraisers to defray cost of trip.

MOTION: Mr. Greer moved to approve AFS Exchange Trip as presented. Mrs. Church second. VOTE: 4-0-0.

MCAS Data Presentation: Ms. Laura Tilton presented PowerPoint on 2016 MCAS Data overview.

- Strong growth in Marshfield
- State comparison with ten like districts
- Data meetings at every school
- Comparison of last years' and this years' data
- Identify students strengths and weaknesses
- Look at Title I students
- MCAS 2.0 is a blend of MCAS and PARCC
- Grades 3-8 ELA and Math are untimed
- Additional accessibility features for Grades 4 & 8 taking test on computer
- Grades 3, 5, 6, & 7 will be a paper test
- Technology staff is working on format for MCAS 2.0
- Giving students and staff information to make all comfortable
- MCAS is just one snapshot of our students

Mr. Greer noted this is another unfunded mandate.

Designation of Warrant Signatory: Act to Modernize Municipal Finance & Government was signed by Governor Baker on August 9, 2016 and became effective November 7, 2016. The 253 Section Act was enacted to improve municipal administration, by reducing red tape and a number of obsolete laws. The School Committee can appoint one member to approve bills/warrants on its behalf. Mrs. Campbell has volunteered as the designated signatory. Warrant reports will be provided at School Committee meetings.

MOTION: Mr. Costello moved to appoint Mrs. Kendra Campbell as the Designated Warrant Signatory for the Marshfield School Committee. Mr. Greer second. VOTE: 4-0-0.

Thanks to State Rep. Cantwell for supporting the Municipal Modernization Act.

Special Education Reserve Fund: Allows school districts to establish a reserve fund to pay, without further appropriation, for unanticipated or unbudgeted costs of Special Education, out-of-district tuition or transportation. The balance in the reserve fund shall not exceed 2% of the annual net school spending of the school district.

MOTION: Mrs. Shrand moved to establish a Special Education reserve fund as described above. Mr. Greer second. VOTE: 4-0-0.

South Shore Educational Collaborative: SSEC is requesting the Town of Milton join SSEC. This requires a vote by all School Committees currently with SSEC.

MOTION: Mr. Greer moved the Town of Milton is hereby admitted as a member of the South Shore Educational Collaborative and the preamble of the Collaborative Agreement shall be amended by adding Milton to the list of members of the Collaborative. Mrs. Church second. VOTE: 4-0-0.

Town of Marshfield Energy Reduction Plan: If approved by both the Board of Selectmen and Marshfield Public Schools, Marshfield will be considered for the Massachusetts Green Communities Grant Program and will receive grant monies. Selectmen voted to approve this week.

MOTION: Mr. Greer moved to approve the Town of Marshfield Energy Reduction Plan as presented. Mrs. Church second. VOTE: 4-0-0.

District Policy Sections K & L: Mrs. Shrand brought forth her questions on sections K & L. Policy sections K & L will be reviewed for a second read and vote on December 6th.
